To the Members of the Commission,

I am writing to express my outrage in regards to the conduct of San Bernardino County District Attorney Michael Ramos.

The assigned FPPC case Number is 10/269, and is on your agenda for 12/9/2010 under item 8.

Once again, Mr. Ramos has flaunted his arrogance by intentionally ignoring the law and committing "perjury" in the process. An offense, which Mr. Ramos himself is currently prosecuting others, and for the same identical conduct.

Mr. Ramos has a well-known reputation as a womanizer and philanderer in most political circles, not just within San Bernardino County, but Sacramento as well.
