Mr. Hammond has been asked repeatedly to recuse himself, by Kan We Help, from each sale of public lands in Herlong where he maintains two businesses and a residence.

Mr. Hammond continues to violate the Political Reform Act by making governmental decisions in which he has financial interests and to protect and secure a position of the only business to offer food or gasoline in Herlong.

Kan We Help filed a complaint, on *February 20, 201*, after Mr. Hammond admitted, during a public meeting, that he had been in secret meetings (3) with one of the bidders (HSP Resources) for public land. Mr. Hammond was asked to recuse himself from discussion and any vote because he was attempting to give one bidder (HSP Resources) an advantage. Mr. Hammond participated in at least three (3)secret negotiations to obtain a government contract for HSP Resources during a public bidding process. Mr. Hammond refused to recuse himself and was the deciding vote to award HSP Resources additional public land (3,400 acres in Herlong). An audio and video are available. Mr. Hammond continues to show no contrition but only contempt for the Political Reform Act and the Open Meeting law (Brown Act).
