Dear FPPC Commissioners,

This comment is separate from the one I filed earlier today regarding Warning Letters issued to D'Autremont-Helms and Subsystem Designs. for campaign finance violations.

However it should be viewed as an illustration of the disparate treatment given to violators of campaign finance regulations.

My friend Evan Patlian became a candidate for the Saugus School Board in 2018. He is young an unfamiliar with campaign finance regulations.

He admittedly failed to file two pre-election statements with the Complainant, the Los Angeles County Registrar.

Upon notification of the violation Evan cooperated and made the required filing.

The FPPC did not offer to settle with a warning letter. Instead, on January 11, 2019 the Enforcement Chief Galena West encouraged a Streamlined Settlement which included a fine of \$233.00

It would appear to me, based on Regulation 18360.1 that a Warning Letter would allowable and appropriate in this circumstance.

Evan Patlain is young and has a refreshing passion for public service. He was a first time candidate and did not win the position. The large majority of funding \$2,000 cane from his own personal resource.

My question for the Commission to consider is, why wasn't a Warning Letter appropriate for Evan Patlain, and is it appropriate to have such disparate treatment for corporate Major Donors and first time candidates.

I respectfully request in the interest of justice that the Commission authorize a reimbursement to Evan Patlain and a Warning Letter be issued to him.

Dear Mr. Patlian:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act"). The Enforcement Division received a referral from the City of Fullerton alleging that your committee, Evan Patlian for Saugus School Board 2018 (the "Committee"), failed to timely file two pre-election campaign statements. The Enforcement Division has completed its review of the matter and found that the Committee failed to timely file one pre-election campaign statement for the reporting period of July 1, 2018 through September 22, 2018, by the September 27, 2018 due date.

The Act requires candidate-controlled committees to file two pre-election campaign statements prior to the applicable election, as well as semi-annual campaign statements until the committee terminates.

You violated the Act by failing to timely file the first pre-election campaign statement by the September 27, 2018 deadline. The Enforcement Division has commenced an enforcement action against you, and can obtain an order that you pay a monetary penalty to the State of California of up to \$5,000 per violation.

The Enforcement Division encourages those whose violations meet the criteria for a streamlined settlement to participate in the streamlined settlement program. The streamlined settlement program allows those who qualify to pay significantly lower penalties for their violations than they would if they do not take advantage of the program. The committee's violation qualifies you for the streamlined program. This is the first time the Enforcement Division has offered to resolve your case through a proposed streamlined stipulation. That being the case, our current offer to settle is \$200 per violation, plus 1% of contributions received or expenditures made, whatever is greater, as reported on the committee's statement(s). The following table details the total proposed fine:

Please note that this penalty will increase with each attempt we make to resolve this matter.

To take advantage of this settlement offer you must:

- 1. Sign and return the enclosed Stipulation, Decision and Order (Stipulation); and
- 2. Pay the \$233 monetary penalty either by cashier's check/money order OR by debit/credit card on the FPPC's website by no later than February 4, 2019.
 - a. If you wish to pay by cashier's check/money order, please make the check payable to the "General Fund of the State of California." Please note that this cannot be a personal check.
 - b. If you wish to pay by debit/credit card, you will need to use the Enforcement Division's electronic payment system available by following this link: http://www.fppc.ca.gov/enforcement/pay-enforcement-penalty.html. Please note that if you wish to pay your enforcement monetary penalty by debit/credit card, there is a 3% transaction fee that will be added to your full penalty amount at the end of the transaction.

If you enter into this proposed streamlined stipulated agreement, the signed stipulation will be presented at the next regularly scheduled public meeting of the Fair Political Practices Commission. Please be advised that the settlement of this case is subject to approval by a majority of the five members of the Commission.
