The Public Outreach and Technology Committee was called to order at 9:00 a.m.

- 1. Public Comment for items not on the agenda.
- 2. Approval of April 7, 2021 minutes.

3. Discussion of FPPC Website.

Jay Wierenga, Communications Director, gave an update on some external feedback received.

4. FPPC Meeting Video Timestamp.

Mr. Crabtree went over the prototype for the meeting video timestamp project and showed some examples of the prototype in action.

Chair Miadich asked if there was an alternate method for the meeting video timestamp project where the links populate with the video.

Commissioner Wilson stated that they should separate the video links from the agenda due to the public possibly mistaking the video links as documents.

Mr. Crabtree stated that tell will research other options that may be at cost, as the current prototype is at no cost.

5. Website Search function

Mr. Crabtree gave a tour on the prototype for the new website search function and showed some examples of the different functionalities.

Chair Miadich asked if searching within a paragraph was possible in the new search engine.

Mr. Crabtree stated that they will have to look into that.

Commissioner Wilson asked if they would be able to track the amount of users who visit the website. Mr. Crabtree stated that they have weblogs and the software to analyze the logs.

Mr. Crabtree showed the information box for the advanced search options on the webpage.

Chair Miadich asked if the team would be able to report back for a decision for the July commission meeting. Mr. Crabtree stated that the timeline is reasonable.
